

**GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF
AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR
OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the October 15, 2018 Order (“Order”) of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the October 15, 2018 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of El Dorado County (“Court”), this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. For purposes of computing time for filing papers with the Court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, October 15, 2018 is deemed a holiday (Gov. Code, § 68115(c));

2. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, October 15, 2018, is deemed a holiday (Gov. Code, § 68115(d));


3. Any judge of the Court may extend, by no more than two days, the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from October 15, 2018, to October 17, 2018, inclusive, because the emergency condition described in the Order prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(e)); and

4. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from October 15, 2018, to October 16, 2018, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 14 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(g)).

This order applies to proceedings in the courthouse at 495 Main Street in Placerville, California.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of fire danger and high winds resulting in a complete power shutdown of the Placerville courthouse, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of El Dorado. Upon the request of Presiding Judge Suzanne N. Kingsbury, it is ordered that the Superior Court of El Dorado County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that October 15, 2018, be deemed a holiday for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a (Gov. Code, § 68115(c));
- Declare that October 15, 2018, be deemed a holiday for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825 (Gov. Code, § 68115(d));
- Extend, by no more than two days, the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from October 15, 2018, to October 17, 2018, inclusive, because the emergency condition described herein prevented the court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(e)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 14 days for cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from October 15, 2018, to October 16, 2018, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(g)).

This order applies to proceedings in the courthouse at 495 Main Street in
Placerville, California.
